From the desk of John McKeagney

Wells of Life is a registered charity which fundraises in the LA/OC area to bring safe water to villagers in Uganda. Founded by Wexford native Nick Jordan in 2008, we have since brought clean water to over 300,000 people. In 2017 we met our target of funding 80 wells.



On April 22 2018, the annual Run4Water takes place in scenic Laguna Niguel Regional Park. Many schools, churches and businesses participate, and it is a hugely fun and upbeat morning. We walk either a 1K or a 5K. The event runs from 8am to noon.

The need is great. In rural Uganda there is scant running water. People are forced to drink water from mosquito-infested surface ponds with a lethal cocktail of micro-organisms. Infant mortality is so high that many parents do not name their babies until they reach their second birthday. Each family spends about six hours a day simply fetching water. This backbreaking slog falls disproportionately on women and girls.

To reach the clean subsurface aquifers cost roughly \$6000 - a sum beyond the means of a typical community. That well will bring clean water to about 1000 people. So for as little as \$6, you can give the gift of life to a person.



In 2017, Team Ireland

funded a new well in the village of Lukoko. Water is heavy. To free up the time spent carrying it is transforming. Girls get to stay in school and mothers have more time to spend with their children. When our team visited there last August, they were met with great appreciation and broad smiles.

The attendees voted that this year's funds should go specifically to brain cancer research. It is to be announced next month which field will benefit from the 2019 gala.


The energetic founders are Belfast natives Ellen Fitzsimmons and Carol McNicholl, both longtime residents of Southern California. Brain cancer took the lives of two beloved family members - Ellen's daughter Sarah and Carol's husband Dick. Ellen and Carol are longstanding friends who first met thirty years ago while camping with their families.

The check was accepted by the Director of the National Brain Tumor Society, who are committed to funding better treatments and ultimately a cure for people living with brain cancer.

Other board members are equally passionate. Says Vice-President Meredith Wisniewski: "Cancer is a horrific beast that needs to be battled on many fronts." Treasurer Martina Looney recalls a mother-in-law who ran marathons until cancer intervened. Kathleen Gonzales witnessed her sister Sarah fight her disease like a champion. An ICU nurse, she bravely continued to work with patients who had the same disease she had. Rounding out the board are Christine McNicholl, Victoria Vonnahme, Erin Fitzsimmons and Angela Wixted.

Following a successful pub quiz at the Harp Inn, the board thought a gala night would raise money and be a forum for change.
