**Subject:** Reading Inquiry for Thriller about the Troubles in Northern Ireland

Dear Irish Center of Southern California,

I'm an Austrian writer whose debut novel 'Belfast Central' was launched on the 10th of April 2018 (in German and English) at the London Book Fair this year. The book is a thriller with contemporary history elements - addressing The Troubles in Northern Ireland. I'm also planning a book tour in the US this year and I'm contacting you because I would like to offer you a free reading.

What is *Belfast Central* about? The story focuses on the young paramedic Ryan who turned down a career in his family's company in the ammunition industry. When he gets shot on duty at the Belfast Central Station he goes through a major crisis. A welcome distraction is the search for the man who saved his life. But the more he finds out about this stranger's past the more dangerous it gets for Ryan. In order to stop the people responsible for the shooting at Belfast Central Ryan has to let go of some of his deepest values.

**Setting and historical background** The story takes place in Belfast in 1993. Some chapters dive into the past (into the years 1932 to 1938), giving the topic a wider scoop than comparable books. My novel is fictional but events of contemporary history are setting the stage for this story (e.g. Belfast Outdoor Relief Strike in 1932).

Why this topic? I became interested in the topic after reading the 'Kevin and Sadie' series written by Joan Lingard – a story about a Catholic boy named Kevin and a Protestant girl named Sadie who 'illegally' fall in love. While reading, one question rose in my mind: Ireland gained independence back in 1921, but the Northern Ireland Conflict broke out in 1969; why not earlier? What happened in the (almost) 50 years between these two events? I did extensive research and integrated the complexity of the answer into my story.

**Topicality** As you know the 20th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement was on the 10th of April 2018 (the day of the book launch). **Reading extract and more** In case you are interested, take a peek into my reading extract:



If you haven't stopped in at the Irish Import Shop in a while you're in for a surprise and a treat!



Before you walk in you'll be delighted by the new view from the street, which is an homage to the classic Irish storefront. Then, once in the door you may feel turned around... literally... as the shop attendant and register are at the front now. Browse the store and you'll see that we still carry all the items you know and love; plenty of Cadbury chocolate, Barry's and other Irish and English teas, McVitie's Jaffa Cakes, Heinz beans and plenty of other Irish and English edibles. Of course you'll find Claddagh rings and jewelry, Guinness pub glasses, woolen caps and sweaters and plenty of Beleek china and Waterford Crystal. But after browsing for a few minutes you'll notice something new... The Wren Theater off to one side of the shop. Yes, that's right, we said theater!

Hollywood's biggest small theater, the Wren Theater performance space can seat up to 40 people. They've already hosted some great events such as a stage reading of "A Child's Christmas in Wales" and a concert featuring Irish singer, Ken O'Malley, as well as an ongoing, open Traditional Music Session every Tuesday night. All are welcomed to participate in the Tuesday night session, which begins at 7:30pm, by playing an instrument, dancing, singing or just enjoying the music and refreshments that are available. Admission on Tuesdays is free and open to all members of Clan Craic, the non-profit, cultural wing of the Shop. Anyone can join Clan Craic by stopping the shop emailing by or

joinclancraic@gmail.com with the subject line "I want to join Clan Craic". More wonderful cultural events are currently being planned, such as concerts and theater events. So come and join us!

For those of you who may not know the history of the oldest Irish import shop on the west coast, the Irish import Shop, founded in 1962, by Richard ("Jonesy") and Annie Jones, started out as a room in the Jones' apartment, but grew in size and demand until 1988 when they opened the present location on Vine street, just north of Melrose. The Shop was bought by Anne Colburn in 2001 who ran it for 15 years until October, 2016 when she retired back to Dublin and passed the baton on to the shop's current proprietor, Thom MacNamara (Tommy Mac).

Thom MacNamara, is well-known in the Irish community of Los Angeles. He was the executive director for the Celtic Arts Center for years and received a Certificate of Commendation from the Los Angeles City Council for his efforts. He was the Producers Guild International Committee's representative to Ireland, and played the bass drum for the Los Angeles Police Emerald Society for over a decade. Tommy has also produced the annual Celtic Concert Series at the Ford Amphitheater for 10 years. So taking over the Irish Import Shop in 2016 was the perfect fit for him.

MacNamara says that creating a space for people to feel at home and enjoy a bit of Irish culture in the madness of Hollywood is what is most important to him. "People like the fact that walking into our homey shop feels a bit like being in Ireland," says Thom. "We play traditional Irish music and create an atmosphere of fáilte for all who enter". The shop is located at 742 Vine Street, Los Angeles, CA 90038 and there's plenty of free parking on-site. Hours are Monday through Friday from 11am to 6pm, Saturdays 11am to 5pm and Sundays from noon to 4pm. Check them out on the web at **irishimportshop.com** or call the shop at





I was confirmed when I was about eleven or twelve years old. We were asked by the Bishop to pledge to abstain from alcohol. I took that pledge and I had my eighty seventh birthday in March and I have never broken it. Thank God!

Now "the feel good" part of this story. My cousin in Portadown, who is a nun and is around the

church all the time, called me and said that there was someone from L.A. who knows me had called the parish office and got information about the Pioneer fifty year pin. The days, the weeks and the months passed without another word until "the Second Sunday of the Month Social" at St Cornelius Church in Long Beach. I was there and Dennis Murray, the ever popular musician, called me to the front of the usual large crowd. Dennis then introduced Gerard O'Hanlon, the well-known Warrenpoint, Co Down man, in Orange County. The "sleuth" then explained as follows: He and his wife Geraldine had been to a function sponsored by the Irish Center of So Calif. They saw me with the regular Pioneer Pin in my jacket. It reminded them that his mother and father both had the fifty year Pioneer Pin. They decided that they would check out getting the special pin for me. I am deeply indebted to Gerald and Geraldine O'Hanlon.
