Dominic Agustus "GUS" Dennison

Gus was born in Letterkenny, Co. Donegal in 1933. He was the youngest boy (of 8 children) when his father died, and as such he was allowed to get away with murder. He worked on the family farm and when he was 15, he worked at the Carrigart Hotel as a bartender.

He soon got the wanderlust, and sailed to NY when he was 21. He worked as a carpenter and he served in the US Army from 1954-57. When he got out it wasn't long before he met a Scottish lass named Cathy Cairns. They were married in 1961 and decided to *vacation* out in California in a '57

Chevy. Soon after, they had their first son, Sean, and never left California.

They found a tight-knit Irish crowd in Alhambra and specifically St. Therese Church. It was at this time he began his career as a master landscaper (the rectory and convent were among his accounts). They had Irish dances with Irish bands with Irish whisky.

He grew his business and as a result became more financially comfortable, leading to more children and a move to a bigger house. Brian was born and then Kyle.

In 1971, they moved from El Molino in Alhambra to De Sales in San Gabriel. Gus and Cathy bought a camper and we would go back-packing in the Sierras, riding trail horses up the High Uintas, whitewater rafting down the Stanislaus or, on special occasions, we would take that trip to Ireland and Scotland. We learned how to fish, to light fires and become young men.

We spent summers in Coronado and winters in Big Bear in our cabin. All the while dad was working from 4:30 am to 4 pm to put his 3 sons through private grade school, private high And when those three sons had children, he would do *anything* for his grandchildren. He told them stories of the wee leprechauns and slipped them a buck or two every time he saw them. He brought pink donuts to one and gave his army jacket to another. He gave them avocados to sell and played with them on the swings. school, and private college. Incredible. We never wanted for anything.

His whole life he was very mischievous and made everybody laugh.

He was a gentleman and a scholar.

Survived by his wife, Cathy; his children, Sean, Brian, Kyle/Valerie; his grandchildren, Rory, Ciara, Liam, Shayleigh, and Fionn.

William (Liam) Joseph Butler May 6, 1937-January 22, 2017

On Sunday, January 22nd, Liam Butler peacefully departed this life at the age of 79 surrounded by family. Born in Birmingham, England on May 6th. 1937 to Michael Kieran Butler and Anne Doyle, Liam grew up at Desart, Cuffes Grange in Co. Kilkenny, Ireland. St. Kieran's College enabled Liam to pursue academic excellence, igniting a lifelong love of literature, language, mathematics, and hurling. Following matriculation, Liam worked for the Kilkenny County Council but later moved to London, England seeking continued opportunity. Finding little, he followed his family to Los Angeles.

In California, Liam met and married Margaret (néeCampbell) in September 1970. After receiving a bachelor's and master's degrees in Mathematics from Long Beach State University, he secured work with the federal government, moving with Margaret to Washington, D.C. It was there that their daughter was born. Longing to return with his family to California, Liam was poised to take the first federal position that became available outside of Washington, D.C. Offered a position in Biloxi, Mississippi, he waited for a second position to open up. It was this second opportunity, at the NIDDK (NIH) Phoenix, Arizona branch that Liam seized. He served as its IT Director until his retirement. In retirement, Liam continued to build computers and tweak other electronic devices with treasures gathered from his temple, Fry's Electronics. In quietude, he could be found sharing an ice cream cone with a dog and French fries with his cat. Despite living far from Ireland, Ireland was never far from his heart as he stoked an interest in Irish sporting events, music, and current events, especially with other Irish expatiates like his friends the Loreto sisters.

Liam is sadly missed and lovingly remembered by his wife, Margaret; daughter, Fionnuala; sisters, Elizabeth, Anne, and Marie; brothers, Michael and Patrick, sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces, nephews, neighbors, and friends. He also leaves behind his beloved cats, both feline and Kilkenny. Liam's keen insight, quick wit, teasing humor, hearty laugh, and kind smile are now gone from our presence. May his imperfections be perfectly preserved in the memories of those of us who loved


