

The MART Gallery curators Matthew Nevin & Ciara Scanlan are delighted to invite you to the preview of ACTS TO OBJECTS at 7 p.m. on March 15, 2018 at LACE Los Angeles.

The exhibition is the final in a three year programme titled "Activating Pangea", a series focused on the promotion of Irish Contemporary Art in Los Angeles curated by MART's Matthew Nevin & Ciara Scanlan. Acts to Objects brings together artists from Ireland and LA that span a number of generations, in order to explore the role of spectacle in feminist practice today.

Art and cultural practice often seeks to challenge the primacy of the visual in Western culture, as dominated by a "pervasive masculinised privileged gaze" (Irigaray). To affect change women artists too have sought ways to refute, undermine and evade this primacy of the visual in art practice in order to find a "visual language and a voice that can be heard" (Mary Kelly).

So too, have artists harnessed and heightened the spectacle of the visual as means to staking a claim to the authorship of cultural practice, and thereby a form of subjectivity. It is in the tradition of these 'attention grabbers' that the artists in this show employ strategies that arrest and twist the gaze, that clamber for visibility. The artworks play with and investigate the idea of art as spectacle, whether refracting and manipulating light, playing on expectations of material form and colour, or performing acts that intervene in social space and norms.

As a set of work disparate in form, from sculpture to performance, together they speak to ideas of spectacle. The artworks shun the lingering forces that continue to undermine women's right to cultural authorship, unapologetic in staking their claim to visibility. The philosophical terms that frame

westernised art practices assert 'calling attention to' as a critical strategy: these artworks glisten, tousle and shout.

The exhibition is staged in Los Angeles, the locus of production of the Hollywood spectacle, that much early feminist discourse critiqued for its dominant gendered narratives that constantly position women as passive objects to the active masculine look, that continues to persist in new forms. Bringing together artists from Los Angeles and Ireland that span a number of generations, in order to explore the role of spectacle in feminist practice today.

'Activating Pangea' is three year series of exhibitions curated by MART {Dublin}, who will work with Los Angeles based galleries and art fairs to strategically promote leading Irish Contemporary Visual Artists

The Curators: Matthew Nevin & Ciara Scanlan.

Since 2008, Dublin based curators Matthew Nevin & Ciara Scanlan have sought to create opportunities by conceiving creative platforms to support artists from all stages of their careers to test new ground. As a curatorial partnership they have curated over 100 artists through several international exhibitions across Ireland, UK, Germany, Norway, Portugal, Greece, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Japan, Jackson Mississippi, New York, Chicago, Los Angeles. In 2013 the curators launched The MART Gallery & Studios {Dublin, Ireland}; housing two large galleries in a renovated old fire station and have expanded their studio network to host over 120 members in seven7 studio buildings across Dublin.



REST IN PEACE



Rosamond Leathem (nee Redmond) passed away on January 8th. She was born on September 24, 1920 to Lucy Ann (Early - from County Leitrim) and Gerald Redmond (from County Wexford). She attended St. Thomas elementary school, Catholic Girls High and graduated from Immaculate Heart College. She was a social worker for Los Angeles County for over 30 years before retiring. She married Fred Leathem on February 11, 1950. She is survived by their had two children Tom and Rita, two grandchildren: Raemar and Tomas Leathem and Norah Selzer. Fred (from County Down) her husband of 67 years passed away on July 9, 2017. Mass is at St James the Less in La Crescenta on Saturday February 17th.

Andy Finnerty passed away on December 13, 2017 in the loving care of the staff at the Karlton Residential Care Center in Anaheim, CA. He is survived by his wife Ann (McPaul), whom he married on January 3, 1970 in Athlone, Co. Westmeath, Ireland, his son Andrew (Kevin), daughter Sinead, son-in-law Jason, daughter-in-law Katy, grandchildren Roisin, Saoirse, and Jack Larkin, sisters Anne and Carmel, as well as many nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews and a large circle of friends. He is pre-deceased by four brothers and two sisters, Michael, Peter, John, and Jimmy, Mary and Brigid (Breege).

Andy was born in Tullintuppeen, Co. Roscommon Ireland on May 18,1934 and was the 5th son of John Thomas and Ann Finnerty. He spent his formative years working on the family farm and helping his



brother Peter in his chemist shop in Frenchpark. He attended Elphin vocational school where he excelled and woodwork. He later went to Tubbercurry, Co. Sligo to work at Gowna Wood Industries and became involved with the GAA, which would a big part of his life from then on out. After working for a summer in London in his early 20s, Andy planned to emigrate to Australia, but his course was changed by the Suez Canal Crisis, and instead, he emigrated to Montreal, Canada on his 23rd birthday with his sister Anne.

Life was difficult at first in Montreal since he didn't speak French, but Andy's outgoing personality quickly led him to the Irish Community where he was asked to be on the St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee, and the

Queen's Selection Committee. He got involved with the local GAA and traveled to Boston and New York with his team to compete. He was also involved in ballroom dancing and an amateur acting group and staged several plays.

While in Montreal, Andy worked for Canada Air, but layoffs between contracts led him to emigrate to the USA in 1964. With his friends Aaron McErlain and Billy McGee, the three set out on route 66, eventually settling in Huntington Park, CA, an industrial suburb of Los Angeles. Since there were not much in the way of Irish activities in LA in the 1960s, Andy and some friends founded the Emerald Isle Club, which quickly grew to eight hundred members. The club sponsored as many as thirty-two functions a year, including Irish field days, Irish Dancing competitions, golf tournaments, bus trips, tennis games, football, hurling, dinner dances, as well as provided an excellent interaction with City Hall. In fact, for one Irish Field day, Mayor Sam Yorty declared July 4th, *Irish Day in LA*.

Andy had an incredible memory and knew as many as 170 Irish songs taught to him by his father, uncles (Pat and James), and neighbors during his rambling days. One of his legacies is the 1916 Easter Commemoration, which started in LA, and later made its way to the Brothers of St. Patrick in Orange County, where he organized a Gaelic mass, the raising of the tri-color, music, and an Easter egg hunt for the kids. He also organized the Brothers of St. Patrick Family Festival, a St. Patrick's Day event that drew thousands of visitors every year and raised much-needed funds for the novitiate.

Andy will be remembered for all the right reasons, he was a devoted to his country, his faith, and family, and was highly principled, and honest to a fault. He was the life of the party, and a great storyteller. As his nephew Kevin Finnerty said, "Can you imagine what he did for those who could never afford to return home from America; he brought Ireland alive again for them, brought it into their rooms, kitchens and workplaces raising their lonely and lost hearts and spirits."

Another one of Andy's nephew's, Paul McCabe perfectly said, "Andy was like the rest of us in that he was perfectly imperfect, but we can all certainly be better people by emulating his passion for life, his style and open expression of that passion, and his love for and commitment to family, friends, and community, I know I am better for having known and loved him."

A funeral mass celebrated by Mgr. Bernie Leheny and Mgr. James Loughnane took place at All Souls Mortuary Chapel, Long Beach, California on December 27, 2017. Internment will be in Tulsk Cemetery, Tulsk, Co. Roscommon. In Andy's memory, the family has funded a well in Uganda, Africa, through Wells of Life (c/o Neil Jordan), which will bring fresh drinking water to an entire village for many years.

How to Lock Your Car and Why (Be Safe)

I locked my car using the remote fob. As I walked away I heard my car door unlock. I went back and used the fob to lock my car again three times Each time, as soon as I started to walk away, I would hear it unlock again!! Naturally alarmed, I looked around and there were two guys sitting in a car in the fire lane next to the store. They were obviously watching me intently, and there was no doubt they were somehow involved in this very weird situation. I quickly chucked the errand I was on, jumped in my car and sped away. I went straight to the police station, told them what had happened, and found out I was part of a new, and very successful, scheme being used to gain entry into cars. Two weeks later, my friend's son had a similar happening....

While traveling, my friend's son stopped at a roadside rest to use the bathroom. When he came out to his car less than 4-5 minutes later, someone had gotten into his car and stolen his cell phone, laptop computer, GPS navigator, briefcase....you name it. He called the police and since there were no signs of his car being broken into, the police told him he had been a victim of the latest robbery tactic -- there is a device that robbers are using now to clone your security code when you lock your doors on your car using your remote fob locking device.

They sit a distance away and watch for their next victim. They see you go inside of the store, restaurant, or bathroom so they have a few minutes to steal and run. The police officer said to manually lock your car door-by hitting the lock button inside the car -- that way if there is someone sitting in a parking lot watching for their next victim, it will not be you.

When you hit the lock button on your car upon exiting, it does not send the security code, but if you walk away and use the remote door lock on your key chain, it sends the code through the airwaves where it can be instantly stolen.

This is very real.

Pass this note on. Look how many times we all lock our doors with our remote just to be sure we remembered to lock them -- and bingo, someone has our code...and whatever was in our car.
