Peggy Saltwell was born in Harrow, London to an English father and an Irish mother Kathleen O'Connor originally from Muckross, Co Kerry. Peggy attended school at the Sisters of the Sacred Heart

in Harrow as a day pupil until her father died unexpectedly when she was 9. Her mother had to return to work outside the home to support Peggy and her younger sister Ann. The nuns allowed Peggy to board even though the family had no means to pay at the time. It was a kindness that Peggy never forgot and later on as her circumstances changed she befriended and supported the BVM sisters, not simply in their local communities of Burbank and Glendale but in their national apostolate. There was further upheaval in her life in 1940 when she, like so many children her age, had to leave London for the countryside during the German "Blitz"

During the war, her mother met and fell in love with an American officer in the US Navy. They were married

and Kathleen, along with daughters Peggy (19) and Ann (11) bade farewell to the UK and embarked on a life and adventure to America. They eventually settled in Glendale where Peggy was head of the insurance agency at Fidelity Federal. It was during this time that she met Normal C. Hayhurst and they were married and lived in Glendale. After seven happy years of marriage, Normal died and Peggy was left a widow. Peggy continued to live life to the fullest, her sense of adventure and "joie de vivre" never waned. She never forgot her heritage however. Although she spoke with a pronounced English accent, and seemed to have that British sense of propriety, she also loved all things Irish and for many years regaled us with her presence and elegance at the GAA games at the Ireland's 32 Pub in Van Nuys at 7 AM on a Sunday morning so

like the Normans eight hundred years before, was in many ways "more Irish than the Irish themselves" Peggy had a big heart and never ceased to give back for the blessings her adopted homeland bestowed upon her and her family. She was active in and generously supported her local parishes, the Ireland Funds, the Pasadena Opera Guild, the YWCA, St. Vincent's Meals on Wheels and St. John of God Retirement and Care center to name but a few.

Peggy was predeceased by her sister Ann in 2012, and by her brother in law Frank Johnson eight days before her in Mission Viejo. She is survived by her niece Katie Janics, nephew Paul Johnson and their spouses, many grandnieces and nephews, also by cousins and extended family in Muckross and Killarney, and many relatives in London and southeast England.

Sister Rose Byrne, age 93, a Sister of Providence for 69 years,

died February 18, 2018, at St. Joseph Residence, Seattle, WA. Vigil Service: Sunday, February 25, 2018, at 6:30 PM, and Funeral Mass: Monday, February 26, 2018, at 11:00 AM, both at St. Joseph Residence, 4800 37th Avenue SW, Seattle, WA. Burial will follow at Calvary Cemetery, Seattle, WA, after Mass and reception. Bonney Watson Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

Rose Josephine Byrne was born July 22, 1924 to Patrick and Bridget (Condron) Byrne, in Ballinahown, County Offaly, Ireland. She was the second oldest of six children. Rose entered the Sisters of Providence in July 1948 at Mount St. Vincent, Seattle, Washington, and in January 1949, she became a novice. In July 1950 she professed first vows and received the name Sister Kevin, and in July 1953 she professed final vows.

In 1950 Rose was a companion at St. Vincent Home for the Aged in Seattle, WA. She graduated in 1953 from St. Patrick High School, Walla Walla, WA. In 1965, she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education and social studies from the College of Great Falls, now the University of Providence in Great Falls, MT. Sister Rose received her Masters of Education degree in June 1971 from Seattle University; and in September she earned American Studies Teaching credentials from UCLA, CA. In 1993 Sr. Rose received diplomas in Religious Studies from St. Patrick's College, a Pontifical University, Maynooth County, Kildare, and from the International Summer School, Trinity College, Dublin, in Ireland. Sister Rose's first ministry of 25 years from 1953-78 was in education as an elementary teacher in Washington: Yakima – St. Joseph Academy and St. Joseph Grade School; Seattle – Holy Family School; Vancouver – St. Joseph School; and Moxee – Holy Rosary School. In California: Sun Valley – Our Lady of the Holy Rosary School; Pasadena – St. Philip the Apostle School; Temple City – St. Luke Catholic School; and Burbank – St. Francis Xavier School, and then St. Finbar School, where she concluded her teaching ministry.

After her clinical pastoral education in 1979-80, Sr. Rose became a pastoral care associate at St. Joseph Medical Center, Burbank, for a short time. Then from 1981-92, and 1993-97 Sr. Rose served as Director of Ministry to the sick and elderly at St. Patrick Parish in North Hollywood, CA.

From 1998-2014 Sr. Rose was the representative for the Sisters of Providence at Providence St. Joseph Medical Center, Providence Holy Cross Medical Center and Providence St. Elizabeth's Care Center. She worked with the Foundation department at both medical centers, providing a "sister presence" in addition to attending funerals, meetings and events at which she delivered invocations, prayers and reflections that she composed herself. She also conducted hospital visits to the sick and their families as well as visits to staff and employees.

On January 6, 2015 Sr. Rose received a Certificate of Recognition from the City of Burbank for her work with the Sisters of Providence, and Providence St. Joseph Medical Center, and her years of charitable service and the positive impact she had on the city of Burbank. Shortly after Sr. Rose retired and moved to St. Joseph Residence, Seattle, where she continued to share spiritual wisdom with those around her. She enjoyed visiting with friends and her sisters in community.



Monsignor Patrick Reilly

Born in Longford, Ireland - April 13, 1934 – Burbank, California – April 4, 2018

Born and raised in County Longford, Ireland, Patrick Reilly was educated by the Jesuits, and at age 17, left for the seminary at Mungret in Limerick. Three years later, he boarded the Britannia, setting sail for the United States. Here he entered St. John's Seminary in Camarillo. On May 1, 1958 he was ordained into the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles at St. Vibiana's Cathedral. That same year he became a U.S. citizen.



Father Reilly was first assigned to St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish. In 1963 he was transferred to Nativity Parish in Watts, where he served until 1967, when he moved to St. Gregory Nazianzen Parish. In 1969 he became pastor of St. Brendan. In 1976 Father Reilly became administrator of Sacred Heart Parish in Covina and was elevated to pastor in 1979. On January 21, 1983, Father Reilly became Monsignor Reilly as he was appointed chaplain to his Holiness Pope John Paul II. Finally, in 1986 Monsignor Reilly was installed as pastor of St. Robert Bellarmine Church. During the next seventeen years he oversaw the redesign of the church interior and the creation of a parish ministry center. With his dedicated support, lay leadership and involvement in parish activities blossomed.

He retired in 2003, continuing to enjoy golf, playing cards, socializing with family and friends and watching all types of sports – especially the Dodgers and the Angeles. As pastor

emeritus, Monsignor was an active support of the parish community. On Sunday mornings he could be found outside the church before and after the masses greeting old friends, welcoming new members and drawing big smiles from the children with his energetic good humor. Every spring he was a constant presence at the festival, cheering people on at the games and helping out at the margarita booth. At the parish Christmas parties, Saint Robert's had the only Irish Santa Claus in town. Following a brief illness, Msgr. Reilly died in Burbank, California on April 4, 2018.

On April 16, 2018, Thomas Sean McConville was sworn in as a Superior Court Judge for Orange County following his appointment by Governor Jerry Brown. Judge McConville is the son of Tom and Joan McConville of Burbank, California. Tom and Joan arrived in Southern California in 1958, and hail from Portadown in County Armagh. Judge McConville is the youngest of their six children.

The Irish Junior National Baseball Team is heading to Grosseto, Italy to compete in the 18U European Championship Tournament. Ireland will take on Italy, Germany, Great Britain, and other countries, in the week-long tournament. The tournament will take place from July 9 - 15, 2018.

The team roster is a mix of Irish resident players and Irish-American dual citizens living in the USA. All players are citizens of Ireland.
