Fred M. Leathem passed away on Sunday, July 9th. He was born in Downpatrick, Co. Down on October 25, 1922. He came to America in January 1948. In December of the same year he met Rosamond Redmond and they were married on February 11, 1950. They had two children, Tom and Rita, two

grandchildren Brendan and Meghan, two great grandchildren Raymar and Tomas with a third great grand-daughter due in October.

Fred worked at the White King Soap Company before going to work at the Los Angeles Times. He left the Times to work with Pacific Press and became the Vice President of the CWA union. He retired in 1992 and for the next 20 years he returned to Ireland in the summers.

Mass was held on Saturday, August 19, 2017, at St. James the Less Catholic Church, La Crescenta, CA 91214.

Kerry, daughter of Don Breyer, died in early August due to a slip and fall accident in her own bathroom. Kerry traveled to Ireland with Michael Breen and a group of Irish dancers in 2001.

Kerry was a civil engineer and worked for the City of Santa Clarita. She died just days before her 49th birthday (August 22, 2017). Kerry went scuba diving all over the world and her ashes went to the place where she loved to be.

James B O'Dea March 20, 1934 - July 31, 2017

James B. O'Dea was born on March 20, 1934 to Patrick and Jane O'Dea in County Mayo, Ireland. He was the youngest of 6 children. Jimmy, as he was most commonly known, passed away at his home peacefully the morning of July 31, 2017.

Jimmy O'Dea met his beloved wife Gretta in Dublin, Ireland while attending University there. Theirs was a romance at "first wink". That was all it took to bring these two together as they crossed paths one day while walking along O'Connell Street in Dublin. They married a few years later and moved to London. It was there they had their first son Kevin in 1962.

In 1964 they set out to follow their dreams of living in America. Jimmy's first job was in the meat packing department of Farmer John before he secured his first teaching position at Pomona Girls Catholic School. From there he moved to teach at Bishop Amat High School for a short time and then finally on to West Covina High School where he remained for 37 years teaching Math, and for a time, coaching soccer.

It was during that time period that Jimmy and Gretta welcomed two more sons, Mark in 1967, and Barry in 1973. It was also during this time that Jimmy earned his Masters Degree in Physical Science from Azusa Pacific University. After moving several times, they finally settled in to their final home in Rowland Heights, California in 1977 where they remained for the rest of their lives.

Gretta O'Dea passed away in 1989 and Jimmy never remarried. Jimmy retired from teaching in 1999 and spent his retirement years enjoying time with his grandchildren whom he adored.

Jimmy also enjoyed spending time with the friends that he loved so much. He really enjoyed golfing, dancing, and especially having a nice meal out with his friends and a nice glass of wine. His charm, his smile, and his sense of humor will always be remembered. His love for his family will always endure.

Jimmy O'Dea is survived by his two sisters, Phyllis and Pauline, his three sons: Kevin, Mark, and Barry, and his six grandchildren: Breanna, Austin, Margaret, Maya, Katherine, and Greta.

John McDermott

July 7, 1927 – June 29, 2007



An Irish immigrant who lived the American dream, John McDermott peacefully passed away on June 29, 2017. He was welcomed to heaven by his parents, Francis and Maria McDermott, his 8 siblings, and his daughter Nora. Born in Manorhamilton, County Leitrim, as the 9th of 10 children, he booked his passage on the Queen Mary in 1948, arrived in America and traveled by bus to Pomona, California to be with his sister Mary. In 1950, he was drafted in the United States Army and fought during the Korean War.

Upon returning to the states, he worked for Southern Pacific Railroad and met the love of his life, Bridget (Bridie) Connolly who hailed from County Mayo, Ireland. They married in 1954 and had 5 children. For several years, he worked for his brother- in- law in the material

handling industry, and at the age of 40, he began his own material handling company, McDermott Equipment and Supply, in El Monte, CA, where he worked until he was 80 years old. He employed many people and he was known as the man in the "caster" business, supplying casters to department stores, grocery stores, airlines, and many other industries. In addition to running a business, he attended night classes at Est Los Angeles College; education was important to him, so he worked diligently to ensure that all his children received a college education. Later in life, he passed the California Real Estate exam and received his license to practice. John's success in business was derived from his ability to be charming and witty with his Irish accent and shenanigans. He carried these traits with him until the very end, telling jokes and making people smile. He was a gentleman who made people at ease with his comforting and happy demeanor. He loved to entertain family, friends and vagabonds, but when it was his bedtime, he quietly disappeared and made his way upstairs. He valued his wife and family more than anything and considered his brother Paddy, his very best friend.

An active parishioner of St. Therese Church in Alhambra for over 50 years, John was a devout Catholic and man of great faith who often could be found silently reciting the rosary wherever he was. He always wore a scapular.

A devoted husband and father, he enjoyed Dodger games and weekends at his beach home with family and friends. He was a man who lived without a cell phone and computer his entire life, yet he remained intimate with those who mattered to him. John is survived by his loving wife of 63 years, Bridie, his 4 adult children, Frank (Nancy) McDermott, Maureen (Sam) Battle, Sean (Anne) McDermott, Eileen (Richard) Smith, and son-in-law William Mace; brother, Cormac; 10 grandchildren: Sam, Caroline and Katie (Battle), Willie, Austin, and Julia (Mace), Brendan and Claire McDermott, and Hayden and Kerrigan (Smith), and 7 great-grandchildren who will forever be grateful for the love he shared with them.

Major Irish government trade and cultural extravaganza announced for Los Angeles, Oct 16th-21st. 2017

Taking place in Los Angeles from October 16th to 21, 2017 its core aim is to bring a live showcase of Irish creativity and innovation to the world.

Launched today by An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar, An Tánaiste Frances Fitzgerald and performer PantiBliss (who will perform 2 shows in LA), Ireland Week is supported by a broad range of government agencies including The Department of Foreign Affairs

and Trade, The Irish Film Board, Culture Ireland, Creative Ireland, IDA Ireland, Tourism Ireland, Enterprise Ireland, Music From Ireland, Board Bia, Aer Lingus and the non-profit American Chamber of Commerce Ireland and the California Irish Legislative Caucus.

Taoiseach Leo Varadkar said: "The Irish Government is very happy to lend support to Ireland Week and the Connect 353 conference in Los Angeles this October. There is significant potential for growing trade & economic links between Ireland and the Los Angeles region. This initiative should help our agencies to promote Ireland as an attractive location for trade and investment. 
