Sister Madeleine Sheehan DMJ 1959 - 2018 Obituary



Sr. Madeleine of the Daughters of Mary and Joseph, was born July 12, 1929, to Edward and Annie Sheehan in Listowel, Co. Kerry, Ireland. Died July 6, 2018, in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA. Predeceased by her parents and siblings, William Sheehan, Maura O'Dea, Tess Conroy and Edward Sheehan. She is survived by her sisters Nina Repetski, Nancy Cahill, Philomena Johnson and Josephine Birmingham. Madeleine was noted for her great love of Irish dancing and achieved excellence in Ireland as a champion dancer. As a longtime teacher in the parochial schools in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Madeleine always included

after-school classes in Irish dancing. Her students excelled in the yearly competition known as the Feis. Madeleine's teaching ministry included the following schools: St. Augustine, Culver City; Our Lady of the Rosary, Paramount; St. James, La Crescenta; Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Mill Valley; Our Lady of Peace, Sepulveda, and Marycrest Kindergarten, Rancho Palos Verdes. Her last teaching assignment was in the Paramount Unified School District as a Reading specialist. The Daughters of Mary and Joseph are grateful to the devoted caregivers and to Trinity Hospice for their loving care of Madeleine in her final weeks. Deep gratitude for the ongoing, attentive care of the staff at Marian Residence where Madeleine lived in retirement for the past 15 years. Rosary will be recited at 10:15 a.m. in Marian Chapel, 5300 Crest Rd., Rancho Palos Verdes, CA 90275, on July 24th, followed by the Mass of Resurrection at 10:30 a.m. Reception will immediately follow. Internment at Holy Cross Cemetery, 5835 Slauson Ave.,Culver City will be at 1:30 p.m. Memorials made be made in Sister's name to Daughters of Mary and Joseph Retirement Fund, above address.

Sister Celine (Mary Agnes) Cripps, RSHM 1921 - 2018 Obituary



January 1, 1921 - June 19, 2018 A Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary for 78 years, Sister Celine (Mary Agnes) Cripps died on Tuesday, June 19, 2018, at Regina Residence in Orange at the age of 97. Born in Dublin, Ireland, one of seven children, she was educated by the Sisters of the Holy Faith in Dublin, and entered the Novitiate of the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary in Tarrytown, New York, in 1938. She received a BA in Liberal Arts from Marymount College, Tarrytown, and later, when she came to California, an MA in English from UCLA as well as Teaching Credentials from USC. Sister Celine's over 70 years of ministry have been in four areas of service: teaching, administration within the Province, formation, and care of our retired Sisters.

Sister Celine's first teaching assignments were for short periods at Marymount Fifth Avenue and Sag Harbor, New York; St. Alphonsus School, Los Angeles, and Sacred Heart of Mary High School in Montebello. She next spent nine years, 1945–1956, at Marymount High School in Westwood, two of them as Principal. Later she returned to teach there for five more years, 1983 to 1988. In 1956 Sister

Celine was appointed the first Mistress of Novices for the new Novitiate in Santa Barbara and over the following eight years under her direction 90 California young women were professed as Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary. From 1964 to 1970 Sister Celine served as Provincial of the Western American Province. From 1970 to 1982 Sister Celine taught English and Theology at Marymount College Palos Verdes, and was voted Outstanding Teacher of the Year three years in a row. A naturally gifted, dedicated, and highly regarded teacher, Sister Celine was loved by all her students, and was always committed to the mission of the RSHM. From 1988 to 1997 she was Coordinator of the RSHM Community Center for both active and retired Sisters in Westchester. After she retired in 1997, she taught Bible classes at St. Anastasia Parish. In 2007 she moved to the RSHM Assisted Living Residence, Casa Guadalupe, in Montebello and continued her Scripture classes at Miraculous Medal Parish. Since 2015 until her death, she lived at Regina Residence. Sister Celine was predeceased by her parents, Mary and Joseph, her brothers, Austin, Joseph, Arthur and John, and her sister Gabrielle, and is survived by her sister Josephine as well as many nieces and nephews. She will be greatly missed by her family, her RSHM Sisters, CSJ Sisters and staff at Regina Residence, past students, and the many people she touched and influenced throughout her life. Funeral Mass for Sister Celine will be at Sacred Heart of Mary Provincial Center, 441 No. Garfield Avenue, Montebello, on Friday, June 29, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. After a light lunch, burial will be at Holy Cross Cemetery, 5835 West Slauson Avenue, Culver City at approximately 1:15 p.m. May she rest in peace.

He loved baseball and was a huge Los Angeles Dodgers fan. James was a member of the Screen Actors Guild. He has appeared in many films, television, and stage productions and was a stand-in for actor Jack Palance. He was also a very active member of St. John Eudes Choir in Chatsworth, California.

Subject: DMV - Renewing License - Ann's experience - sharing this so you, or a family member, will be prepared -If you are too young to need this information, just be aware of it so you can help a friend or a relative.

At 70, in California, for a driver's license renewal one has to take a written test. This can come as a complete surprise to a lot of people because up to that age, they automatically got their renewals in the mail.

Read the renewal notice carefully - it will say a written test is required.

Below, is my neighbor's experience of yesterday ... so you can be prepared. I hope it helps someone on this list. It helped me. When mine comes up for renewal later this year, I plan on going to the Stanton Office.

Two friends of mine had their licenses renewed in Long Beach recently - at the DMV Office on Willow. The place was packed and it took hours and hours for them to wade through everything.

I read in the paper last Sunday, July 8, where Rich Archbold, Columnist for the Press-Telegram, went to the DMV Office on Artesia Boulevard in Bellflower. He got there at 8:20 a.m. He had to park three blocks away. He did not have an appointment and as he waited until the last minute to renew he was stuck. He got his license at 4:35 p.m. It was a horrible experience for him.

On Jul 12, 2018, at 11:35 AM, Ann wrote:

Hi Mary:

Things went as well as could be expected, considering I was dealing with the DMV. The Stanton office was easy to get to - barely 15 minutes and parking was good. Once in the office, I was able to go right to the appointment window, with only one person ahead of me.

That's where my problem began.

I was applying for a REAL driver's license - federally compliant with the rules to go into effect in 2020 (or it might be 2021). At that time a regular driver's license won't be accepted to board a plane.

To get a REAL license I had to submit proof of birth (Passport), a utility bill in my name (to prove where I live), and a Social Security card (or proof of number). I had the first two, but proof of Social Security number wasn't adequate, even though the document I presented was from Social Security and showed "Social Security Number - - "

They said they would allow me to keep the appointment if I wanted to go home and get a benefits' statement, which is "pink."

Away I went - back home. Couldn't find anything pink, so just took my whole Social Security file, which contained every piece of paper I ever received from Social Security. That wasn't good enough - they said the document they needed is a 1099.

Do you know what a 1099 is? It is the tax form we receive at the beginning of each year giving the amount of Social Security benefits we received for the previous year!!!

When I was home it crossed my mind to take the tax return for 2018, but then thought my Social Security file would contain sufficient proof of my number.

Bottom line is that they issued me a temporary driver's license and I have to go back within 60 days with my documentation for the REAL driver's license!!!

I was going to request a new Social Security card but can use the 2017 - 1099 in lieu of the card. At least I don't need another appointment - can just walk up to the appointment window.

Also, I didn't need an appointment at all, since I have a handicap placard! I don't know if that's the case with all the offices though. (continued on next page)

John's mother had to get her driver's license renewed yesterday too, and she went to Westminster. From what John said, she didn't have a good experience. Aside from employees who can't make decisions on their own, which shouldn't have surprised me, Stanton was a good place to go.

Even with two round trips, it only took two hours, and an hour of that was commuting.

To get there, go south on the 605 to 405, south on 405 to 22 (Garden Grove freeway), exit Beach and go left (north) 3/4 mile and it's on the left. Driving time was less than 15 minutes.

I opted to take the test electronically. Initially, I requested to take the paper test, but when I got in line I was behind a gazillion people and the line wasn't moving at all. I concluded there was a long line because those people didn't want to take the computer test, or maybe do not know how to use a computer.


So I got out of line and went up to the window for computer testing and got to a computer right away. There were 18 questions and your answer is only transmitted when you hit the "submit" button. You can skip up to 3 questions, which will show up at the end of the test to have another chance to answer.

The questions weren't difficult and I missed one - it was something about "If you run from the police at a traffic stop and then evade police, you can be (1) fined \$1,000, (2) jailed up to 1 year, (3) I can't remember the third one, but it was definitely incorrect." I marked either (1) or (2) - can't remember which one - but I selected the wrong one. I was definitely guessing at the answer on that one.

All in all, not to bad an experience. It's just a shame that employees aren't allowed to use their own judgment in cases like that. They were just like robots there, saying "Social Security card or 1099."


