After fifteen years of service in the Los Angeles Archdiocese, Donal continued to serve for many years as a problem-solver in management at a precious metals


company based in Santa Fe Springs.

Born in Aunagloor Millstreet, Co. Cork, Ireland, to Daniel & Ellen Corkery Mulcahy, he immigrated to Southern California in 1947 to enter St. John's Seminary, Camarillo, CA. Donal was ordained to the priesthood on 5/19/1951 and his first assignment was to Cathedral Chapel Catholic Church in Los Angeles, where he met many lifelong friends. He later served at St. Basil's Catholic Church and St. Vibiana Cathedral in Los Angeles, La Purisima Concepcion Parish in Santa Maria, and in 1972 became Pastor of Our Lady of Assumption Parish in Ventura where he served as Pastor until 1997, then Pastor Emeritus until 2014 when he relocated to the Nazareth House Retirement Community in Los Angeles.

Monsignor Mulcahy served as a Judge on the Archdiocese Marriage Tribunal from 1973-1978, was named a Monsignor in 1978 and was invested as Chaplain of the Order of Malta in 1993. In May 2001, Monsignor celebrated his 50th year as a priest and in 2012 he was honored by Our Lady of Assumption Parish for his 40 years of service as well as being honored by St. John's Seminary as a Distinguished Alumni. Monsignor enjoyed many years of golfing with his brother priests, parishioners and friends and upon retirement served as Chaplain on Crystal Cruise Ships for many years sailing on two world cruises and many shorter cruises sailing to ports all over the world. Monsignor is survived by his sister Mary Francis Howard, brothers Tom, Joe and David Mulcahy, 16 nieces and nephews, 43 grandnieces and -nephews and 5 great-grandnephews and -nieces, as well as loving friends Shirley Shanahan & family of Ventura, Gary & Beverly Herman & family of Los Angeles and his many dear friends at Our Lady of Assumption Parish, who continued to remember him with birthday, St. Patrick, Easter, Christmas and get well cards and phone calls. Monsignor was a very special man, a wonderful example of priesthood by his warm and friendly Irish charm and loved by all who knew him. Funeral Mass will be at 11 AM, Saturday, June 22nd, at Our Lady of Assumption Catholic Church in Ventura. Celebrants will include Archbishop Jose Gomez, Bishop Thomas Curry and OLA Pastor Father Leon Hutton. Immediately following the Mass the parish is hosting a reception. 

Open Fist revives Brian Friel's evocative masterpiece 'Dancing at Lughnasa'

LOS ANGELES (June 18, 2019) — The beautiful, rolling hills of Ireland hold many stories and secrets. **Open Fist Theatre Company** presents **Dancing at Lughnasa** by the great Irish playwright **Brian Friel**. **Barbara Schofield** directs Friel's Tony Award-winning masterpiece for a **July 12** opening at **Atwater Village Theatre**, where performances will continue through Aug. 18. Pay-what-you-want previews begin July 6

Hailed by *Time* magazine as "the most elegant and rueful memory play since *The Glass Menagerie*," *Dancing at Lughnasa* is set in the summer of 1936 during the Celtic harvest festival of Lughnasa. Five unmarried sisters — Kate, Maggie, Agnes, Rose and Chris — live in the rural Irish countryside outside the tiny village of Ballybeg; loosely based on the lives of Friel's mother and aunts, the play is a rich and deeply moving portrait of their everyday lives, as remembered through the eyes of Chris's seven-year-old son, Michael, now an adult.



"In this historically contentious and divisive period, I long to bring to life a play which speaks so poetically to our common humanity" says Schofield, whose directing credits include previous Open Fist productions of *Machinal* by Sophie Treadwell, *Rock 'n' Roll* by Tom Stoppard and *Stage Door* by Edna Ferber and George S. Kaufman. "*Dancing at Lughnasa* is a play about love and loss and family, about dreams and disappointments and desire. A play in which magic is still possible in the face of life's harsh realities. Where the lives of simple, flawed characters struggling to survive are ennobled by something greater than their personal successes or, more often, failures — ennobled by their passionate desire to live, to connect with each other and to remain human."

First staged at Ireland's Abbey Theatre in 1990, *Dancing at Lughnasa* transferred to London in 1991, winning both the Olivier and Evening Standard awards for best play. It opened on Broadway the following year, earning additional Tony and New York Drama Critics' Circle best play awards. Overwhelming international recognition brought it to the big screen in 1998 with Meryl Streep in the role of Kate.

The Open Fist production stars artistic director **Martha Demson** as Kate at performances in July, with

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company member **Jennifer Zorbalas** (*Anna in the Tropics*) taking over in August. **Lane Allison** (*deLEARious*) plays Maggie; **Ann Marie Wilding** (*What Matters Now?/!* political pop-up) portrays Agnes, **Sandra Kate Burck** (*The Gary Plays*) is Rose, **Caroline Klidonas** (*All Night Long*) plays Chris, and **David Shofner** (*What Matters Now?/!*) looks back on it all as Michael. Also in the cast are **Christopher Cappiello** (*Walking to Buchenwald*) as their brother, Jack, recently returned home after 25 years as a missionary in Uganda, and **Scott Roberts** (making his Open Fist mainstage debut, previously seen at the Odyssey, Rubicon, A Noise Within, Pacific Resident Theater, Boston Court) as Michael's father, who shows up for a rare and unexpected visit.

The creative team includes scenic designer **James Spencer**, lighting designer **Matt Richter**, composer and sound designer **Tim Labor**, costume designer **Mylette Nora** and prop master **Bruce Dickinson**. The choreographer is **Jason Gorman**, and the dialect coach is **Deborah Ross Sullivan**. The production stage manager is **Jennifer Palumbo**.

Brian Friel (1929-2015), often described as the "Irish Chekhov," won international acclaim for his distinctive blend of melancholy and humor. He is known for exploring themes of cultural identity and social change, loss and disillusionment, the search for belief and the yearning for transcendence, the power of the imagination and the lure of escapism, the importance of language and the significance of history. In 1996, *New York Times* Sunday theater critic Vincent Canby called Friel Ireland's "greatest living dramatist," writing that he "dazzles us with plays that speak in a language of unequaled poetic beauty and intensity." Friel's oeuvre includes 24 published plays, including *Philadelphia*, *Here I Come!* and *Faith Healer*.

Open Fist Theatre Company is a collective, self-producing artistic enterprise with all facets of its operation run by its artist members. The company's name combines the notion that an open spirit, embracing all people and all ideas, is essential, with the idea that determination, signified by a fist, is necessary if the theater is to remain a vital voice for social change and awareness.

Dancing at Lughnasa opens on **Friday**, **July 12** at **8.p.m.**, with performances thereafter on **Saturdays** at **8 p.m.**, **Sundays** at **4 p.m.** and **Mondays** at **8 p.m.** through Aug. 18. There will be one additional Friday night performance on **Aug. 16** at **8 p.m.** Four preview performances take place on Saturday, July 6 at 8 p.m.; Sunday, July 7 at 4 p.m.; Monday, July 8 at 8 p.m.; and Thursday, July 11 at 8 p.m. Tickets are **\$25** with advance purchase, **\$30** at the door on Saturdays and Sundays; **\$20** with advance purchase, **\$25** at the door on Mondays and on Friday, Aug. 16; and **\$40** advance purchase and **\$45** at the door on Friday, July 12, which includes a post-performance opening night reception. Tickets to previews are **Pay-What-You-Want**.

For this large scale exhibition at <u>CIACLA</u>, Irish muralist and visual artist MASER transforms the main exhibition space into a fully immersive hand-crafted installation. Taking inspiration from one of the great natural beauties of Ireland – <u>Glendalough Valley in County Wicklow</u> – the installation reinvents the valley's expansive landscape for visitors to the gallery.

On a daily basis in Ireland, hundreds of locals and tourists travel to Glendalough to marvel at its rugged landscape and to trek its journey. It is a place of rural beauty and a place that deeply resonates with the artist. Through Maser's signature use of vibrant colours, flowing patterns and playful shapes, the installation at <u>CIACLA</u> pays homage to the valley's breathtaking views, and plays on the idea of differing perspectives and organised view-points. The artist has created a site specific, immersive installation that is bursting with colour and encourages visitors to become fully captivated by the valley's abstracted landscape.

Having lived in Arkansas for many years, Maser has a close relationship with the United States – while also holding his Irish roots close to his heart. He travelled extensively around the globe, yet the Irish landscape is a place that distinctly evokes a sense of home for the artist and is strongly rooted in his identity. With the installation at CIACLA, Maser strives to create an inclusive and authentic experience for visitors to engage with his representation of contemporary Ireland.

About the Artist

Maser truly embodies the centric spirit of contemporary visual art in Ireland today. Having created artwork since 1995, over the last 24 years, Maser has earned much respect professionally and has generated a large and dedicated following in Ireland and abroad - through his seamlessly imaginative and unique graphic style. Maser is ambitious and is unafraid to experiment with any artistic format.

Since the outset, Maser has continuously progressed his artistic style and practice, which is now firmly rooted in the gallery space, and moreover, in the realm of contemporary Irish Art. Having credited his origins in street art for the initial evolution of his personal style, his artistic practice today comprises of his unique typographic style combined with photorealistic elements, which usually convey an uplifting and socially conscious message to the viewer. The content of his work is inspirational and offers the viewer an opportunity to become fully immersed in an almost hypnotic state, through his use of contrasting colours and the use of repetitive patterns.
