Dear Friends and Colleagues,

As many of you may know, I plan on retiring as Honorary Consul General of Ireland effective June 30th 2017 after fifteen years in that position. It is time to hand over responsibilities to a younger person willing, able, and experienced to expand the outreach of the Consulate's work in serving the Irish Community. Someone positioned to fully embrace the opportunities and challenges offered by social media in that expansion.

I signaled in October 2015 my intention to step down after the Easter Rising Centenary Commemoration Ceremony of April 2016. At that time, I was informed, the Irish Government planned to appoint a career Consular Officer in Los Angeles. Pending that appointment I agreed to continue as Hon. Consul General. Now, unfortunately, eighteen months later, that decision has been put on the "back burner" with no appointment pending.

Consular work has expanded exponentially in the past fifteen years. For example, back in 2002, with no direct LAX /Dublin flights, Tourism Ireland had a representative here. Now we have eleven weekly nonstop direct flights LAX/Dublin and no Tourism Ireland representative. Post "Brexit" applications for Irish Passports both new and renewal have grown. Visa questions are being asked daily. Direct flights have increased the workload.

A Career Consular Officer in Los Angeles should be an urgent need.

The Irish Community in Los Angeles and surrounding Counties is large, diverse, dispersed, and sometimes fractured. Without a Consulate and the support that brings there is no kernel around which activities and networks can be built upon and sustained.

Reflecting on the past fifteen years I recall significant events, such as, welcoming to Los Angeles two Irish Presidents, two Taoisigh (Prime Ministers), twelve Irish Government Ministers, some several times, the Garda Commissioner, two Attorneys General, EU Ambassador, several Irish Ambassadors, First Minister and Deputy First Minister of Northern Ireland.

Issuing 1150 Emergency Travel Certificates, handling circa 21,000 Irish Passport Applications or Renewals and 6,250 Irish Citizenship Applications.

Establishing the California Legislative Irish Caucus.

Welcoming arrivals of Ethiopian Airlines and Aer Lingus on inaugural Dublin/LAX flights.

Welcoming and hosting the Irish Special Olympics participants to Los Angeles.

Supporting the ten Irish/American Organizations here.

Dealing with deaths, repatriations, suicides, injuries, accidents, arrests and deportations of Irish Persons here.

When the Irish Government announces my replacement he/she can be assured of my full cooperation and assistance, in an Emeritus capacity, in expanding the role of the Consulate in Los Angeles. As I have said to friends I am not going away but am fading away from the Leadership Role I have played in the Irish and Irish/American Communities over the past fifteen years.

To all who have assisted me in ways small and large over the past fifteen years I extend a sincere thank you. In particular, I thank Mary O'Neill and Dorys Jaramillo whom I have depended upon for legal and other advice in emergencies. Their assistance, even under trying circumstances, was always given with a gracious smile.

I thank the many Irish Ambassadors, Consuls General and Vice Consuls who have come and gone over the fifteen years most of whom I had a decidedly personal, friendly and productive working relationship with. I thank the San Francisco Consular Staff, particularly Diane Kierse-Donohoe, for their professional support.

I was fortunate to be Chief of Protocol of the 102 Country Los Angeles Consular Corps for thirteen years. This allowed me the opportunity to ensure Ireland remain center stage in all National and International events in Los Angeles. I shall miss the camaraderie of the Consular Corps.

I publically thank my wife Carmel for her unstinting support of my work despite at times great personal inconvenience.

The Christmas Doctor, Book Two (by Tom Weber, son)

Dr. Weber graduated from medical school at Loyola University of Chicago in 1917. He then interned at Oak Park Hospital, which was administered by an order of Catholic nuns. One wonderful nun, Sister Joan, befriended the young Dr. Weber. She encouraged him through this difficult period. He then saved her sister's life by removing a bullet from her head one night during the Christmas season. Both Sister Joan and her sister were immigrants from Ireland.

Dr. Weber later became a courageous country doctor in Wyoming and Idaho. He hiked to a mine in the primitive Chamberlain Basin of Idaho during December of 1933 to attend to a miner who had fallen from a metal capsule which ran on a cable high in the air. Dr. Weber became ensconced on a ledge high above a valley floor while hiking home. Trapped in an apparently hopeless position, his recollection of a comment made by Sister Joan during his internship years earlier inspired him to leap to a distant point of safety.


