

Subject: New book about Belfast

Dear. Mr. McConville,

I'm John Rickerby's son. Last time we spoke was when my father passed away on 12/21/14. If you recall, I wanted to mention his book The Other Belfast in his obituary and you thought it might sound crass. I've always felt funny about that and wanted to explain. The fact is I felt guilty for not helping him put his book together fast enough because he was already showing signs of the Parkinson's and Dementia that would take his life when the book was released in 2010. It will always be a regret that I didn't help him finish his memoir sooner, even decades sooner, so that he would have had more time to enjoy talking about it with his friends. I suppose I was in denial about his aging. The only consolation is that it was his responsibility to finish and publish his book more than it was mine. He talked about it for literally forty years and even wrote most of it but it was all languishing in boxes in his garage. Seeing that he was getting older with no sign of finishing it, I finally took it upon myself to format and publish it for him, but he had precious little time to enjoy it. However, the first year that it was out, his great mind was still mostly intact, and he said, "I never finished my memoir because I thought 'who the hell am I to write an autobiography? I never went to the moon and survived a POW camp. But after reading the book, I realized my life was extraordinary in its own way. Thank you for that." It was one of the greatest moments of my life, and I think of those words now when I'm kicking myself for not getting his book done sooner.

So that's my round-about way of explaining why I wanted his book mentioned in his obituary. Sheer

frustration, regret and shame that I didn't do more for him. I've been sharing chapters of his book ever since, anywhere I can, and especially his poem titled Ulster that he wrote in the 1970's during the height of "the troubles." One of the places I shared it was on a Facebook page for a book titled Through the Eyes of a Belfast Child by Greg McVicker. Greg and I became friends about four years ago as a result, and he recently asked me if I would like to write a book with him and another author named John Sexton, who was born and raised in Donegal. The book is called Four Green Fields. It's a collection of stories and poems about Belfast and Ireland, and my father is heavily featured in it. In fact, we authors are the "four green fields", and as always, it is a comfort to me to share chapters of my father's memoir in this new book, and write stories about him. It's an empty kind of comfort since he isn't here to laugh along with me, but I'll take what I can get.

He always had great respect for you and I still remember listening to your radio show when he took the family out in the old blue Corvair on weekends. Those were my father's happiest days, when he was involved in the Irish community, writing letters to the L.A. Times and Belfast Telegraph about the troubles. I recall he was even interviewed on TV once or twice. Your radio show helped him feel connected to his hometown of Belfast that he still loved so much. Thank you for that, too.

I am attaching the book and its cover as a gift to you for your kindness when my father passed. I hope you enjoy it. We haven't published it yet so if you'd like to send a testimonial when you're finished reading it, I would be very proud to feature it in the book. Thanks again and warmest wishes,

# Subject: Official Government decision to open new Irish Consulate in Los Angeles

A chairde, friends,

I wanted to bring to your attention the decision by the Government of Ireland today to proceed with planning to open a full Consulate of Ireland in Los Angeles. The new Consulate is part of the *Global Ireland* plan to expand Ireland's global footprint between now and 2025. I have attached the Government's statement and also remarks by the Taoiseach Leo Varadkar, which I encourage you to read.

Timelines at this point are still being worked out but today's announcement is a firm commitment by the Government of Ireland, which recognises the enormous links already between Ireland and Southern California, and the potential to further develop and deepen our connections into the future.

I want to pay tribute at this point to former Honorary Consul, Finbar Hill, who during his over 15 years as Honorary Consul in LA where he was an important member of Team Ireland, made clear the necessity to establish a full Consulate in Southern California.

The Consulate in San Francisco will continue to have responsibility for consular services in Southern California until the new Consulate is established and we look forward to continuing working with you all until then.

On a personal note, I wish to thank all of you for the warm welcome Caoimhe and I have received across Southern California since our arrival eleven months ago. I also want to pay tribute to your on-going efforts and support in maintaining and deepening the links between Southern California and Ireland, in celebrating Irish culture and heritage, our language, our sport and the enormous contribution that the Irish and those of Irish descent have made, and continue to make, to Southern California. From the vantage point of San Francisco, John and I know that the new Consulate, when established, will be fortunate to have such an incredibly talented and supportive Irish and Irish-American community to work with and to serve.

## HAPPY RETIREMENT TO RICK GOULD



Rick Gould has over 40 years of Parks and Recreation experience. For nearly 17 years, Rick has served as the Director of Parks, Recreation, Community Services, Arts and Open Space for the City of Santa Clarita. His leadership, strategic planning and ability to create partnerships with other agencies has led to the addition of 25 new parks and facilities and numerous programs and events. He's worked with staff, the community and partners to develop projects as large as an Aquatic Center/Sports Complex while also focusing on smaller, but much-needed parks in remote neighborhoods. He has worked to preserve historic sites, conserve natural resources, and served on various boards including the

Santa Clarity Valley Committee on Aging (Senior Center), Boys and Girls Club, and the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy just to name a few. Prior to Santa Clarita, Rick also served this profession for the Cities of Pleasanton and Santa Cruz.

In Santa Clarita, Rick utilized a forward-thinking approach to reorganize the Parks, Recreation, and Community Services department. In 2003, Rick realized that event production functions were spread across the department and had a vision of bringing these functions together as the Arts and Events Office. Rick charged the team leader to utilize a different organizational philosophy that reimagined the traditional organizational chart. Each event or project had a coordinator who would serve as the oversight role for that particular event, and the rest of the team was accountable to the coordinator. This style of management was dubbed "hub and spokes" and resulted in more capacity and flexibility.

Rick's dedication to the profession is apparent through his support of CPRS over the span of his career. Rick encourages staff to participate in this important organization because he knows that it provides great leadership and networking opportunities. This is evidenced by the fact that each year since 2008, District 14's board has been comprised of a majority of Santa Clarita staff.

In 2008 Rick helped revitalize District 14 by hosting a district meeting to encourage participation which has remained strong to this day. (*California Parks & Recreation – Spring 2018*)

# **How to Lock Your Car and Why!!**

I locked my car using the remote fob. As I walked away I heard my car door unlock. I went back and used the fob to lock my car again three times. Each time, as soon as I started to walk away, I would hear it unlock again!! Naturally alarmed, I looked around and there were two guys sitting in a car in the fire lane next to the store. They were obviously watching me intently, and there was no doubt they were somehow involved in this very weird situation. I quickly chucked the errand I was on, jumped in my car and sped away. I went straight to the police station, told them what had happened, and found out I was part of a new, and very successful, scheme being used to gain entry into cars. Two weeks later, my friend's son had a similar happening. While traveling, my friend's son stopped at a roadside rest to use the bathroom. When he came out to his car less than 4-5 minutes later, someone had gotten into his car and stolen his cell phone, laptop computer, GPS navigator, briefcase, you name it. He called the police and since there were no signs of his car being broken into, the police told him he had been a victim of the latest robbery tactic -- there is a device that robbers are using now to clone your security code when you lock your doors on your car using your remote fob locking device.

They sit a distance away and watch for their next victim. They see you go inside of the store, restaurant, or bathroom so they have a few minutes to steal and run. The police officer said to manually lock your car door-by hitting the lock button inside the car -- that way if there is someone sitting in a parking lot watching for their next victim, it will not be you.

When you hit the lock button on your car upon exiting, it does not send the security code, but if you walk away and use the remote door lock on your key chain, it sends the code through the airwaves where it can be instantly stolen. This is very real. Pass this note on. 
