There are few words to describe the excitement felt in our home, when we were young children, as the long nights and cold dark days led up to the most important day of the year. Christmas began to loom before us, not long after we returned to school after the Summer holidays. There were seven kids in our family growing up and it was a warm and loving household, not that we didn't have our sibling "dust ups' occasionally. It was a time when thoughts of Santa Claus coming with all sorts of goodies and presents, and Uncle Jack's gift boxes from London, were awaited with bated breath. Yes, he sent two: one containing beautiful books for everyone and the other filled with the finest fruit cakes, and everything sweet you could imagine that was rarely seen in our house or, for that matter, around Ireland. Candied fruits, dates, cookies and candies...and, always a special gift for my mother, usually an expensive perfume she would never have dreamed of spending the money on herself.

My father, a long time member of the prestigious golf course, the Royal Dublin Golf Club, would annually win one of the many "turkey competitions" which were weekly events starting in October, and as he was such a great player would usually win more than once and therefore claim a ham as well, to provide an awesome Christmas dinner for all.

It was a spiritual time, even for our young growing minds, and going to midnight mass was a rite of passage as we grew older and a big part of the celebration. You knew you were a big kid when you were allowed to go.

Like every home that was blessed to be able to share in this wondrous time, we woke up to the pandemonium of my four brothers, two sisters and I ripping gift wrapping apart and exploding with excitement. Many times our father took some of us out to the golf club after breakfast and we walked the course while he played a round, usually just ourselves as the course was practically deserted. My father never lost a chance to play a round of golf in his life, even Christmas morning. We would arrive home early afternoon to the wafting smells of food cooking and relatives arriving for the rest of the day.

The Christmas dinner was a spiritual experience in itself, as the turkey was removed from the oven, the ham was glazed and the myriad of vegetables and trimmings were laid out on the formal dining room table. At least a dozen people, annually, gazed on this gastronomical sight and the wine was opened and the lemonade was served to the wee ones. Following the sherry trifle, Christmas cake and plum pudding with brandied cream, all that was left to follow was the afternoon's TV entertainment and uncles and aunts snoring quietly in armchairs, hands laid on fortified tummies.

As we grew older, there were parties to attend and the music and song would fill the night. Many of the songs we sang are on my Christmas CD, "Songs By A Winter's Hearth", available through my website <u>www.kenomalley.com</u>.

We followed a lot of the old Irish Christmas traditions in our house. Fresh picked holly with red berries, representing the crown of thorns and the blood of Christ, was hung around the house. Decorations were displayed everywhere, and the Christmas Tree was decorated and lit in great splendor. The Pascal red candle was lit in one of the windows, showing strangers they were welcome and a reminder how the Holy Family searched for a place to spend the night in Bethlehem.

Dublin was deserted on Christmas Day back in those long gone days in the late '50's and into the 60's. Everyone stayed indoors and there weren't that many cars on the roads back then anyway. There was a very light scheduled bus service on that day and I remember once, aged about fourteen, going for a walk in the dark early evening with a friend and we never saw a car on the road and saw one bus pass us.

It's a changed Ireland these days but it is wonderful to believe that the Spirit of Christmas is still alive and well in Ireland. We are renowned world wide for our generosity to charities, our good nature and hospitable reputation at home in Ireland. These characteristics have also traveled with us as we have spread our diaspora internationally and enjoy the recognition of our sense of humor and solid citizenship, and particular strength of family bonds, no matter what country we find ourselves.

#### **Prof Noel O'Connor**

Noel O'Connor is Interim CEO of Insight the SFI Research Centre for Data Analytics. He is a full Professor, School of Electronic Engineering at DCU, with expertise in multimedia content analysis, computer vision, machine learning, information fusion and multi-modal analysis. His

applications domains include content-based information retrieval from large archives, human movement understanding for health and human performance, autonomous vehicles, security and safety, IoT and Smart Cities.



#### Damian Breen

Damian Breen serves as a Deputy Air Pollution Control Officer at the <u>Bay Area Air Quality Management District</u> where he oversees the 150 employees working in the technology program. His portfolio includes the Air District's Engineering Division, Strategic Incentives Division, Software Development Office and the Technology Implementation Office.

Mr. Breen acts as an advisor to the Air District's Board of elected officials on air and climate issues, the future of energy and transportation, and the intersection of big data, machine learning and the environment. He also serves as an advisor to <u>University of California Berkeley's Transportation Sustainability Research Center</u>, and has traveled with both the Governor of California and California Secretary of State to Europe and Asia to provide policy advice on air quality, emissions monitoring and reduction, alternative fuels, energy and transportation.

Mr. Breen previously served as the Director of the Air District's Strategic Incentives Division, where he oversaw the investment of over \$100 million in grant funding which reduced diesel particulate matter emissions from Port of Oakland by 80%. He also worked for 10 years in the Air District's Compliance and Enforcement Division and previously for Home Savings of America Bank and various environmental consultancy firms in the United States and Europe. He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in science from the National University of Ireland and a postgraduate diploma from the Irish Institute for Technology.

## **REST IN PEACE**

Thomas "Tom" Barrett Dec. 8, 1932 to Oct. 24, 2019



Tom was born in Listowel, Co. Kerry to Ellen and Michael Barrett and was the fourth of six children. At the age of 17 he emigrated to London, England and then eventually onto Brisbane, Australia. Within that year he would follow his brother Bill and his family to a place called Mount Isa and there he worked in the silver, copper and zinc mines for the next 7 years. While in Mount Isa he worked with many newly emigrated young Irish guys who got together and formed the Mount Isa Irish Association. They agreed to pay dues, ask the mines for scrap lumber and metal and every Sunday on their day off worked together to build an "A" frame one room structure. On March 17, 1955 they held their first St. Patrick's Day dance. This same organization would bring him back to Mount Isa for the 40<sup>th</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup> reunion celebration of that first St. Patrick's Day dance.

In 1958 he emigrated to California to stay with his sister Kate and her husband Mike to "try it out" as he would say. Eventually he got a job with the local Hughes Markets that would give him a 38-year career with that organization. He was going to the Irish dances in Los Angeles with his friend Joe O'Malley and eventually he met our

mother Frances and they were married on September 16, 1961.

He and mom bought a house and soon they were raising three children, Mary, Bernadette and Kieran. They were meeting many Irish friends in the neighborhood as they would say "like themselves" or supporting the Columban Father's functions or Ireland's Own Social Club and later the Irish Center of Southern California. He would work all the overtime he could get "to keep a roof over our heads and food on the table." Both he and Frances would make many life-long friends throughout the years and would enjoy their company immensely. As we grew up, dad would take us camping every summer to Lake Casitas, Carlsbad State Beach or Carpinteria State Beach and we saw a great deal of California with our summer camping trips. Dad had a love of soccer throughout his life that he would pass on to his three children and eventually his four grandchildren. After mom died in 1992 and his subsequent retirement, he began to travel with us, Aunt Kate or friends to places such as Ireland, England, Australia, New Zealand, Tasmania, Hawaii, Laughlin or Las Vegas.

Tom was a good friend to many and would help anybody out, he never said a harsh word against anyone and in his later years when he was not driving as much he was reaching out to friends and family by telephone. The conversations would usually start out with "How's she cuttin or wait till I tell you this one" He loved to tell a good story and a good joke. He was a great singer and often sang the Irish Songs but mostly will be remembered for his whistling the Irish tunes. He was an avid LA Times reader and would call to tell us what article he read in the paper that day and further give his opinion.

He taught his three children many life lessons and we are the people we are today because of Dad and Mom. He lived a great life surrounded by his family who loved him dearly: Mary, Bernadette and Hector, Kieran and Courtney, his four grandchildren Connor, Killian, Matthew and Keegan further his sister Catherine (Kate) Montgrain and many nieces and nephews. He will be greatly missed.
