STEAK AND GUINNESS PIE

Makes 1 pie – 4 servings

- 12 inch Pie pastry
- 1 or 2 pounds of Round steak
- 1 tablespoon of Flour
- 1 tablespoon of Brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon of Raisins
- 5 medium size onions
- 8 slices of bacon
- 3 tablespoon of shortening/butter
- Some Chopped parsley
- 1 bottle of Guinness stout (not the 'draught' variety)



Dice the steak, cover with flour and brown, with the bacon, on a medium heat using the butter. Peel and chop the onions and brown over a good heat. Add to the meat in a casserole dish. Add raisins and brown sugar and Guinness. Cover the dish, simmer and cook over a lowish heat for 2.5 hours. Add water if the gravy mixture starts to thicken excessively. Coat a pie dish with half of the pastry and bake. Add the Meat and Gravy mix when cooked and place the remaining pastry on top and bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown. Serve with potatoes and vegetables.

I am a Galway-based historian, translator and Irish-language writer, originally from Hartford, Connecticut. I am writing to let you know about my new book, *Recovering an Irish Voice from the American Frontier: The Prose Writings of Eoin Ua Cathail*, which is now available from the University of North Texas Press.

This bilingual volume brings together the writings of a nineteenth-century, working-class Irish emigrant from County Limerick, Eoin Ua Cathail (or John M. Cahill). His works were all originally written in Irish, and are made available in English here for the first time. Ua Cathail's stories blend the American Western genre with Irish myth and folklore, while his letters and editorials offer fascinating insights into the use of the Irish language in the United States, US politics at the turn of the twentieth century and the everyday working lives of Irish immigrants in the West and upper Midwest.

Chris O'Dowd's new film! The true story of an Irish man who lost 10 million gambling

Tony O'Reilly stole a million from the post office to fuel his gambling problem before running away to Northern Ireland

County Roscommon actor Chris O'Dowd is set to make a movie from the true story of an Irish man who gambled away €10 million.

Tony O'Reilly, a County Carlow man, became front-page news in Ireland when in 2012 he stole €1.75 million from the postal service office he was the manager of in Gorey, County Wexford. Nine years later Irish man Chris O'Dowd, who now lives in the United States, has bought the rights to bring his story to the big screen.

O'Reilly's gambling addiction which had developed over a ten-year period was such a serious problem, that he had accumulated a €10 million turnover in his Paddy Power betting account under the name 'Tony10'.

When his fraud was discovered, Tony went on a desperate run to Northern Ireland but was ultimately caught and sentenced to four years in jail.

Ten years on, Tony is now a qualified addiction counselor with Extern Problem Gambling, which gives talks in schools and to groups about gambling addiction and also provides individual counseling.

In 2018, O'Reilly released a book that would become a best seller titled "Tony 10: The Astonishing Story of the Postman Who Gambled €10m and Lost it All". Co-written by journalist Declan Lynch, their hope was to highlight the problem of gambling in Ireland and how it can easily escalate and ruin people's lives.

In a personal article written for [The Irish Times](#), O'Reilly said, "My decision to write this book was a tough one. I knew it would reopen wounds for the many I had hurt. But eventually, I decided to do it, because I felt it was so important to draw attention to the sheer scale of problem gambling in Ireland. How easily it can take control, and how quickly it can destroy your life."

Today Tony is now a qualified addiction counselor with Extern Problem Gambling, which gives talks in schools and to groups about gambling addiction and also provides individual counseling.

Declan Lynch said the story was made for the big screen: "One of the strange things about writing the book was that so much of it felt like something out of a movie — so much drama in it, and yet it all really happened.

It's a movie I'd love to see myself. The story is completely Irish and also completely universal."

O'Reilly [explained](#) that, "Chris O'Dowd said he wanted to bring it to a wider audience because it is an important story to tell ... and this will bring the story to a totally different audience and highlight what is a huge problem in Ireland and abroad."

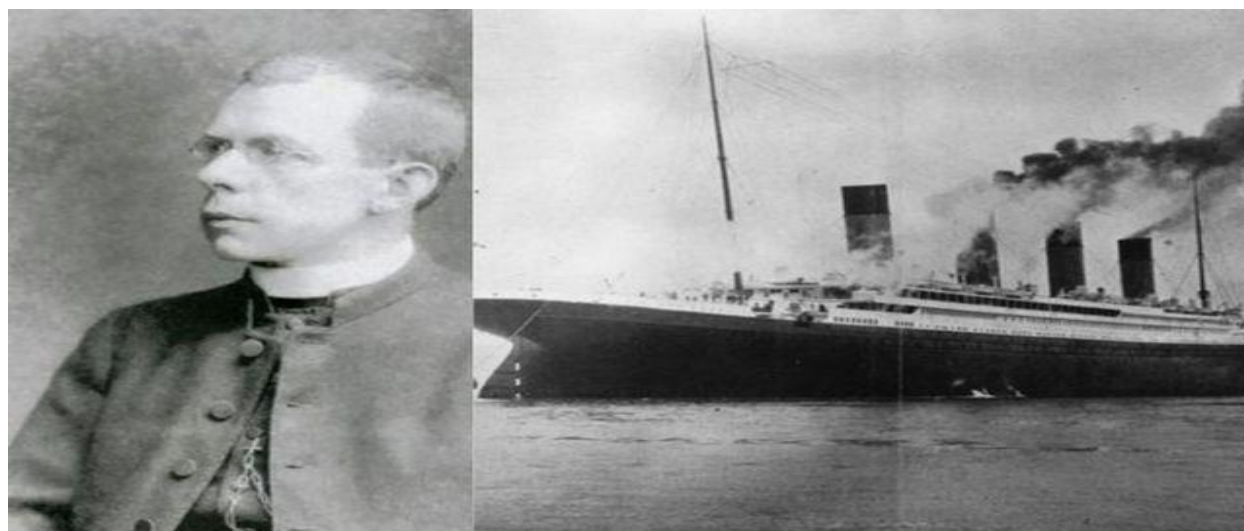
Catholic priest who saved Irish passengers on Titanic could become a saint

Fr. Thomas Byles heroically rushed to save third-class Irish passengers rather than secure safe passage on a lifeboat during the sinking of the Titanic.

A Catholic priest who heroically led dozens of Irish third-class passengers on the Titanic to safety in 1912 has been placed on the path to sainthood.

Fr. Thomas Byles was born to a Protestant minister in Leeds, England, but converted to Catholicism while studying theology at Oxford University. Born Roussel Byles, Fr. Byles was ordained in Rome in 1902 and took the name Thomas.

Ten years later, Byles' younger brother William, who also converted to Catholicism, asked him to travel to New York to officiate at his wedding, leading the young priest to book a ticket on the Titanic's ill-fated maiden voyage.

Fr. Byles boarded the Titanic as a second-class passenger in Southampton on April 10 and enjoyed a quiet time on board before the ship struck an iceberg near midnight on April 14, 1912.

The priest, who was reportedly out on deck praying his breviary when the ship struck the iceberg, courageously ran in the opposite direction as lifeboats were being deployed.

Fr. Byles made his way to the ship's steerage, where numerous third-class passengers were attempting to navigate the ship's labyrinth of stairwells but often found themselves trapped behind locked doors.

The English priest calmly led dozens of third-class passengers, including many Irish passengers, to the top deck where they were able to access the limited supply of lifeboats.

When the crash came, we were thrown from our berths," said Irish passenger Ellen Mary Mockler. "We saw before us, coming down the passageway, with his hand uplifted, Father Byles.... 'Be calm, my good people,' he said, and then he went about the steerage giving absolution and blessings."

Mockler said that Fr. Byles was offered the chance to escape the ship but refused a place on one of the last lifeboats so that he could stay and pray with passengers who had been left behind.

"Father Byles could have been saved, but he would not leave. After I got in the boat, which was the last one to leave, and we were slowly going further away from the ship, I could hear distinctly the voice of the priest and the responses to his prayers," she said.

As the ship began to sink in earnest, Fr. Byles said the rosary and prayed for the souls of those about to perish. He also administered the last rites to many passengers who had been unable to secure passage on the lifeboats.

Fr. Byles's heroic and selfless actions on the morning of April 15 may have set him on the path to sainthood.

Fr. Graham Smith, a Catholic priest who heads Fr. Byles's former parish of St. Helen's in Ongar, England, has launched a campaign to honor "an extraordinary man who gave his life for others".

Fr. Smith introduced the cause for Fr. Byles's beatification in 2015 and hopes that people around the world will pray to him so that miracles can then attributed to him.

"We hope people around the world will pray to him if they are in need and, if a miracle occurs, then beatification and then canonization can go forward," Fr. Smith told the BBC in 2015.

At least two miracles must be attributed to Fr. Byles if he is to be recognized as a saint.
